The United States (U.S.) health care system is failing and approaching a fault phase, economically speaking. Billions of dollars are being paid for fraudulent claims submitted by providers for a range of schemes, from billing for services not provided to submitting claims with fraudulent diagnosis and treatment information. The Medicare program has been in place since 1965 and is the backbone of the U.S. health care reimbursement system; despite its importance, the amount of Medicare fraud is staggering, making it almost impossible to know exactly how much health care fraud there is in the entire U.S. health care industry. The question is-how much money is lost annually to Medicare Parts A, B, C and D program fraud? Government and industry experts state that the amount of fraud ranges from 3% to 10% in the health care program, and one estimate claims that the Medicare program is plagued with 20% losses from fraud. The 2010 passage of the Health Insurance Reform legislation has allotted several billion dollars to launch a 10-year fight against Medicare fraud. Historical information is lacking on what percent of

claims submitted to Medicare are fraudulent. This paper addresses whether or not an agency should be created that would be responsible for tracking Medicare fraud to determine the effectiveness and efficiency of the fight against it. The current study will survey health care fraud experts in both private and governmental industries and will allow the researcher to arrive at a solution by obtaining valid statistics for measuring accurately the impact that the Health Insurance Reform Legislation will have on the mitigation of Medicare fraud.

Drug overdose, driven largely by overdose related to the use of opioids, is now the leading cause of unintentional injury death in the United States.
